JOB SUMMARY

The incumbent is responsible for undertaking a range of environmental economic work with public and private sector clients. Duties include: cost benefit analysis, contributing to environmental impact assessments, critically reviewing environmental policies from an economic perspective, and development and assessment of policy options.

1.	Advises on the analysis and development of economic policy instruments such as trading systems, green taxes, and financial incentives.
2.	Contributes to the formulation of government economic policies relating to environmental issues.
3.	Studies the effects of government economic and monetary policies, taxation, and expenditures on the environment and the economy.
4.	Analyses how environmental policy and regulations interact with growth, trade, productivity, and competitiveness.
5.	Conducts research on local, regional, national, multilateral, and global markets.
6.	Presents economic and statistical concepts and results in effective ways.
7.	Estimates the economic and environmental effects of changes in legislation or policy on government, industry, and society at large.
8.	Estimates the effects of environmental legislation on the economy using economic instruments.
9.	Conducts research to develop forecasts for economic trends.
10.	Develops and applies economic models to analyze environmental issues.
11.	Promotes understanding of the socio-economic drivers of biodiversity loss.
12.	Addresses concerns and questions from the public and attend public meetings.
13.	Calculates the value of environmental goods and capital.
14.	Provides advice to decision- and policy-makers.
15.	Performs any other related duties as may be required.

MINIMUM TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

- Minimum of an Undergraduate Degree from an accredited University in Environmental Science, Economics or in a related field.
- Minimum of five (5) years prior working experience applying economics to matters of environmental policy research and analysis.
